





HOW TO BE AN ALLY



Listen to trans people

Center trans people and not yourself, work towards needed change

State your personal pronouns and use the personal pronouns of others

- Avoid making assumptions about a person's gender identity and pronouns
- When you mess up, apologize and move on

Use gender inclusive language

Use "Welcome everyone" instead of "Welcome ladies and gentlemen"

Know that being transgender or gender non-binary is not about a person's appearance

Accept that a person's identity is real whether you understand it or not
